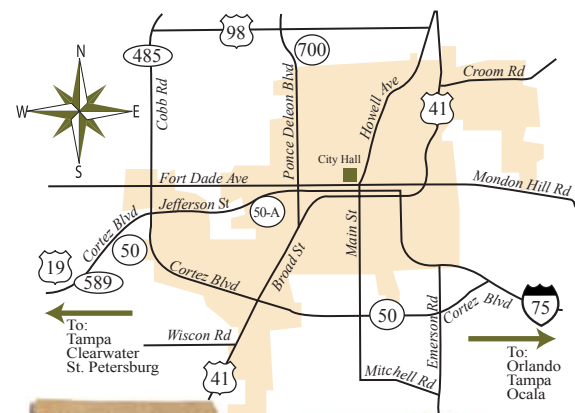
The towering live oaks are still here. So are the antebellum homes. And that genteel spirit that gives the South its charm? It's in full bloom all year long.

Directions

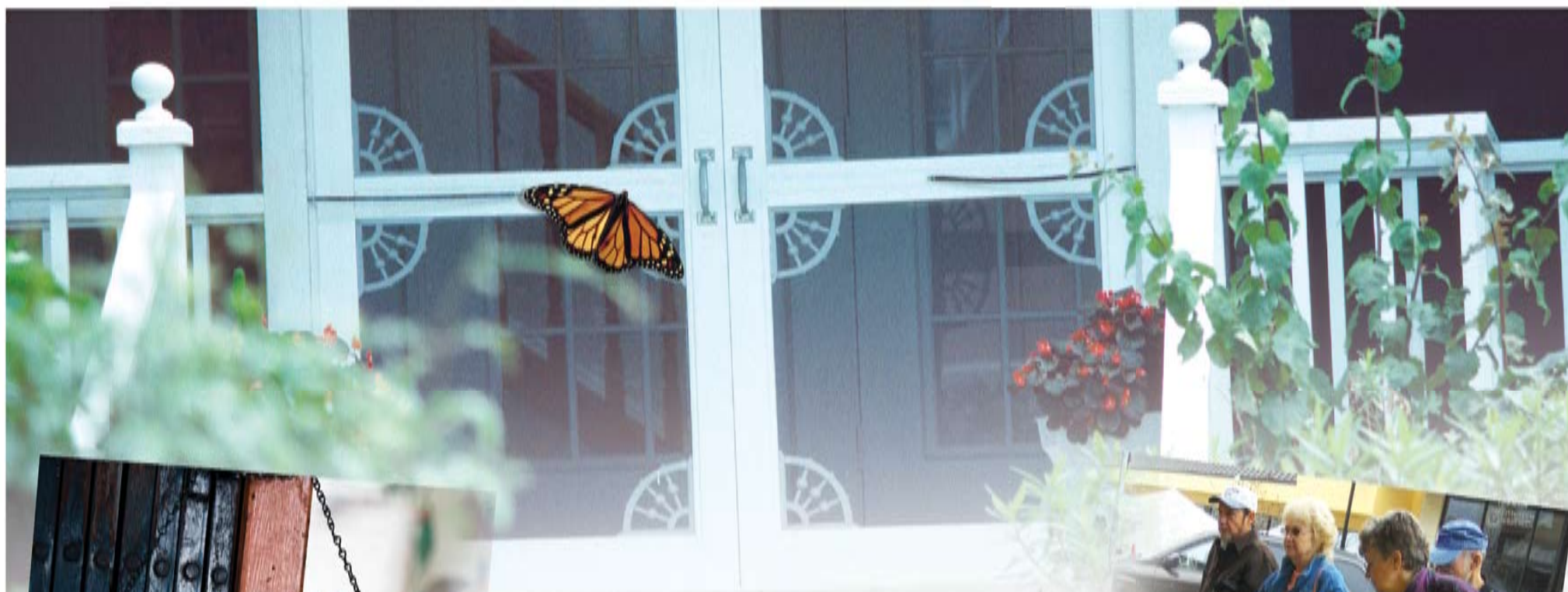
The city of Brooksville in Hernando County is located on State Road 50. From Orlando or I-75, take SR 50 west. This becomes Jefferson Street and leads into downtown Brooksville.

From Tampa, head north on the Veterans Expressway toll road, which becomes the Suncoast Parkway. Continue north; exit at SR 50. Turn right (east) onto Cortez Blvd/SR 50. This becomes Jefferson Street/SR 50A and leads into Brooksville. Tampa International Airport is 40 minutes from Brooksville via the Suncoast Parkway.
